Success stories		Parents, Families, and Home-based Early Child Development: KIOO worked with families to help every child to get best start in life. Since for the full and harmonious development of a child's personality. KIOO has been empowering children from an early age to become authors of their own lives. The process of nurturing young children to achieve this begins in the earliest stages of life and heavily depends on the environment in which a child is raised. Optimal conditions at home, responsive and adequate feeding, interactions with parents and caregivers and				

non-violent disciplining practices, all greatly affect a child's wellbeing. Providing safe and stimulating home environment, which allows children to play, explore and discover, is a critical piece of this process and can exponentially increase a child's chances of flourishing, attaining an optimal level of development and later becoming a responsible and productive adult.

We achieved these through Community Health Workers (CHWs) whom we trained on how to monitor these at community level and report back to us every month. After information have been collected we conducted quarterly meetings at council level with various stakeholders aiming at ensuring enabling environment for nurturing care services reach all children through presence of sustainable support and advocating for inclusion of nurturing care across sectors to ensure provision of holistic services for all children.
