<p>Success stories</p>	<p>This is the best success story from Munge village where TAWREF has built one PPE Classroom.</p> <p>SUCCESS STORY 1</p> <p>“EDUCATION IMPACT TO CHILDREN AT MUNGE VILLAGE, SIHA DISTRICT, KILIMANJARO REGION</p> <p>Munge village was among the villages that lacked access to ECD facilities for children aged 0-6 years as well as a primary school. Based on statistical data from the head of school at a nearby schools of Embukoi it is estimated that 70% of children from Munge village went to that 4-7 kilometres away. Some children were not attending school at all due to distance and unsafe conditions. <i>During the farming season, there are many challenges, as children walk long distances more than 4 kilometers in the middle of the farms crossing flooded gullies to go to school worrying about their safety and protection.</i></p> <p><i>Due to TAWREF’s focus on the most vulnerable community with remotely located children funding was obtained from Kidshare to construct a PPE classroom at Munge village.</i></p> <p><i>“I am extremely grateful to Kidshare through TAWREF for constructing a PPE classroom at our village, now I will not waste my time anymore taking my child to a near school”</i>Says Mary a parent from Munge village..</p>

Following the efforts made by TAWREF together with the commitment of the leaders and the villagers of Munge who were thirsty for school, the government added nine classrooms and administrative buildings thus upgrading the ECD facility into a PPE facility.

“After the government saw the efforts of TAWREF and the villagers, they have given us money to build a fully fledged primary school, indeed, TAWREF, you have become the door of blessing for us, thank you very much,” Said Winnie, a Munge village executive officer.

Through a PPE classroom supported by TAWREF and a primary school constructed by the government Munge children will enjoy early grade learning opportunities which will stimulate their brains ready for standard one, reducing the dropout rate of pupils, and will increase pupils’ enrollment and also academic performance at Munge village from January 2023 onward. The community commitment in taking care of the project continues because it was their long term desire.

For the sustainability of this project Munge village initiated an IGA of a vegetable garden, which will be used for classroom maintenance after selling the vegetables the money will help also in the payment of transport for teachers.

“My mother gave me new clothes and shoes for school. In the morning she gives me porridge and I got to school with my friends. At the school we sing, count, swing and drink porridge”.

“Our classroom is more beautiful than other classes. I love the pictures. Our teacher loves us just like our mothers. She teaches us new songs”. said Joynes.
